## Прощай (Goodbye)

The story of the Russian Sailor came to its conclusion this week, after several weeks of translating quite a few email messages. We were in touch with the gentleman, and it seems he was on a lovely European holiday having visited Holland first, Shotley next, having saved up for more than 10 years for his trip. Luckily one of our volunteers has knowledge of Russian language, isn't it amazing how wide ranging are the talents of our volunteers!

When this lone, Russian yachtsmen arrived in the Harwich Haven in his slightly damaged yacht, he had little fuel and was helped to purchase more at Shotley Marina. He moored up at Shotley Pier, which is not currently safe for use by vessels or pedestrians.

The Society's Pier Master issued a Movement Order to the Owner/Master, as both the vessel and any crew were in danger. Unfortunately, either he did not understand or just ignored the instruction, and did not move his yacht as directed. He then travelled to London without contacting the authorities or the Society. The day after a Final Movement Order was issued, the Russian sailor's luck ran out and his vessel became damaged as the wind changed from off shore to on shore whilst he was absent. This situation could not be allowed to continue as the yacht and the pier could have been damaged even further.

The Society came to the rescue and moved the vessel to a safe berth, keeping in touch with the authorities and ensuring that all due processes were followed.

His whereabouts were not known for almost two weeks so a notice was posted on the pier gate for him to contact the Society at its Registered Address. This he did and he is now happily on his way to Russia via Amsterdam, after paying the Society's invoice for the recovery of his yacht.



John Davitt, Chairman, said "We are looking forward to welcoming people to the pier, but not until it has been repaired, and always within UK border control regulations. Several of our Board members have prior experience of working in ports, so knew when and how to liaise with the authorities"
