#### Industrial Rail on the Pier

Thanks for your feedback asking how we might celebrate the industrial rail heritage. If you have any photos to help us with this topic, please send!

Graham Feldwick advised several possibilities for commemorating the industrial rail history. The simplest would be to lay a very short length of track (6 foot) and place a replica wagon on it.

It might be a feature to lay the narrow gauge rail along 300 feet or so. This is yet to be discussed and decided, so as ever, your opinion is welcomed.

Graham hasn't come across what sort of wagon was used on the rail – maybe a 4 wheeled flat wagon, with a wooden top on a metal chassis. Such chassis are quite easy to come across, and making the top would be an enjoyable volunteer task. Short rails are easily come by too.
