Theft of motor vehicles up to 56 in last year, 20 up on the previous year, especially keyless cars

Anti social Behaviour down was 322 now 296, -2%

Actual bodily harm, down 28%

Robbery from person, up to 54

Robin Coates, Wherstead Parish Council, some youths had pulled an electric fence across a public bridleway and then when the lady had managed to get under the fence they continued to harass a lady and child, the police where then called on 999, however the police never responded!!

Bill Davies Stratford St Mary, the annual meeting of the neighbourhood watch was in Coddenham last night with Tim Passmore in attendance, do we or should we have contact with neighbourhood watch, Covid did put a stop to a lot of meetings, Police connect will give you updates daily on local crime

Nick Carter Flowton, many village signs are unable to be seen as they are overgrown with vegetation, Suffolk County Council issues, report it online

Gordon McCloud Hadleigh Town Council, we report it but sometimes we have to get our own contractors to do it. Mick Fraser at Suffolk County Council, he will help with it

Steven Wells Claydon and Whitton Parish Council, over 3000 vehicles have been recorded using the bus gates, some with no MOT or insurance, reported on a weekly basis, Inspector Matt Breeze suggested that a ANPR camera is to be fitted and the licence for that has been applied for, unfortunately the police cannot act on other peoples reports, the situation may help with the changes and be able to get someone to patrol the gate more often.

Samantha From Flowton, do the police consult on planning applications, the police are not a statutory consultee on planning applications and they have to be sent to Phil Kemp for comment but he is not a statutory consultees on planning

Peter Gower Hadleigh Town Council, recent meeting with Babergh district council and what they have found is there is no collective way to receive complaints

Peter Watson at Babergh District Council is collating antisocial behaviour complaints and getting it to the correct departments, but it still needs to be reported to the police as well
